Corrupted expressions of the promise

- 1) PHARISEES: Rigorously followed traditions and practices that set them apart from society.
- 2) SADDUCEES: The sophisticated, wealthy and pedigreed who sought advantage in society.
- 3) ZEALOTS: Sought to overthrow society through armed resistance and guerrilla warfare.
- 4) ESSENES: Withdrew from society choosing to live in monastic communities.

3. Jesus established the entity that would represent the promise to the world – THE CHURCH. Matt 16:13-18
