Christmas Traditions: Giving

OVERVIEW

Matthew records in his gospel (2:1-12) how the Magi came from the east to worship the “king of the Jews.” Most scholars agree that these extraordinary men used their knowledge of astrology to locate Jesus, as they journeyed from Persia to worship him. In keeping with their culture, they brought “their gifts of gold, incense & myrrh” to pay homage to this newborn king. How remarkable that even those still in darkness would recognize the world-changing event of Jesus’ birth, travel so far to see him firsthand, and then bow in worship at their arrival!

INTERPRETIVE & THEOLOGICAL HIGHLIGHTS

“To tithe or not to tithe, that is the question!” Any message on giving begs the question, “is tithing (the giving of 10%) the standard of giving in the New Testament?” Or, is that just Old Testament law? Well, yes and no. It’s true, that for the Nation of Israel, a tenth was always representative of their resources. Devout Jews actually gave several tithes that added up to about 20-30% of their giving. It’s also true that the New Testament never instructs us to give a tithe, but instead encourages believers to give regularly (1 Corinthians 16:2) an amount that God has led, and to give that amount in a cheerful fashion. (2 Corinthians 9:7). So, if we can do so cheerfully, why limit ourselves? 😊
