# P.A.S.S. Questions For Sunridge Life Group Leaders

For the week of March 30-April 5, 2014 – #gracetogo (Matthew 28:16-20)

- **P** participation (get everyone involved in the dialog)
  - 1. In your world, where have you seen God's glory (His infinite worth and beauty) displayed?
  - 2. Is the idea that a Christian is called to serve as a missionary to family, friends, neighbors, and colleagues new to you? How do you feel about that?
- A application (makes it personal)
  - 3. Who do you know in your life right now who has a tangible need that you could meet?
  - 4. As a home group, study group, or interest group how could we "seek the welfare of the city" (Jer 29:7) together? (Serve at The Brook together? Serve a neighbor with a need? Offer to babysit? Throw a block party on your street?)
- **S** scripture (thinking biblically is a learned behavior! :-)
  - 5. Using the Cheat Sheet, review the components of a missional church.
  - 6. How might our view of the Bible change as we realize it's a book about God and not about us? (Although it's written <u>for</u> us.)
- **S** sharing As there is time over the next couple of months, review the updated values of Sunridge.
  - Do they reflect who we are?
  - Where are we strong?
  - Where do we need to grow and develop?

# **Grace To Go (#gracetogo)**


## March 30, 2014

#### I. INTRO

- A. We're going to begin something new today each sermon will be accompanied by a Twitter hash-tag. (#gracetogo) If you have a question or a comment about the sermon you can post to the hash-tag on either Twitter (@sunridgechurch) or the Sunridge FB page (www.facebook.com/sunridge) and we will engage over any questions the same day. Sometimes we'll post a link to a helpful resource...
- B. Today we'll be talking about #gracetogo and we'll be in one of the most famous Bible passages – Matthew 28:16-20. This passage is referred to as The Great Commission. But first, let's watch a clip that will help us to see where we're headed today → Blues Bros Clip.
- C. Today Matthew 28:16-20 "Then the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. 17 When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. 18 Then Jesus came to them and said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Therefore go and make disciples [not converts] of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> and teaching them to obey<sup>1</sup> [Lit. "to guard"] everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."
- D. I'd like to zero in on Matthew 28:19...Just the first two words...
  - 1. What does it say? "Therefore GO"
  - "What does it mean for us to go?"
  - 3. There are two types of churches:
    - a. **Attractional Church** An attractional church seeks to bring people through the doors on weekends for preaching and teaching, with a high degree of excellence and cultural awareness.

NASB: observe.

b. **Missional Church** -- A missional church is a church that is allowing itself to be shaped by participation in God's mission and seeking to be engaged with the non-Christian culture that surrounds it.



- d. Today I'd like for us to consider what it means to be a Missional Church. We're calling it #gracetogo

#### II. BODY

- A. God has a MISSION, a MEANS, and a METHOD
  - 1. What is God's mission? God's MISSION is the manifestation of His own glory.
    - a. What does **manifestation** mean? It means to <u>exhibit</u> or <u>display</u>.
    - b. What is God's glory? The public display [or, radiance] of God's infinite beauty and worth. It's a glimpse of eternity crashing into (or, intersecting with) the

<u>present</u>. [a beautiful sunset, the northern lights, one of your children sound asleep in their bed – and then there are the more profound encounters]

- 1) Isaiah 6:5ff "Woe is me, for I am ruined! Because I am a man of unclean lips..."
- 2) Luke 5:8 (Peter) "Depart from me for I am a wicked man!"
- c. Here are two more snapshot verses:

"For the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the Lord, as the waters cover the sea." -- Habakkuk 2:14


"And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw His glory...full of grace and truth." – John 1:14 [There was an in-breaking of God's power that accompanied the ministry of Jesus. We can think of it as a down-payment of what is to come.]

- d. God's mission is that He might be **known** and **enjoyed** above all things.
- e. One way to illustrate the **mission of God** is for us to think of the Trinity God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.
  - 1) Jesus Himself identifies the Trinity in our Matthew 28 passage today when He tells the disciples to "baptize in the Name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit."
  - 2) Certainly the Trinity is a great mystery...someone described it as trying to understand a cube in a 2-deminsional world.
  - 3) One author just <u>begins with the obvious</u> stating the Trinity means that God is, in essence, **relational**. Three persons in dynamic orbit about each other, <u>a dance</u> of [perfect] love, [perfect] delight, and [perfect] adoration.<sup>2</sup>
  - 4) So, one way to think of God's mission is that we, that humanity, has been invited back into the divine dance to re-engage Shalom -- undefiled harmony with God.
- f. Which brings us to our next point...

- 2. What is the MEANS of God's mission? The MEANS of God's mission is Jesus Christ and the work He did on the cross.
  - a. The Bible refers to this work as the gospel...
  - b. The gospel is the *good news* that Jesus died and rose from the dead to restore our relationship with God.
  - c. Last week we said that the first mention of the gospel was way back in Genesis 3:15, right after Adam and Eve sinned, God sought them out and set in motion a plan for redemption.
    - 1) The Genesis 3:15 gospel promise becomes an organizing theme for the whole rest of the Bible -- and the rest of human history.
    - 2) We never outgrow our need for the gospel, which is necessary for both salvation and transformation.



- d. The gospel stands at the center of God's redemptive plan, and in it we see God most clearly for Who He is and what He has done.
- 3. This brings us to our third point -- What is the METHOD of God's mission? The METHOD of God's mission is you and me the Church.

- a. Mission is not just an activity carried out by special people in faraway places Mission is the character of the church in the Temecula Valley.
- b. In a nutshell, We (the Church) are all called to live as missionaries within our current sphere of relationships. What does this mean?
  - 1) It means that we are to be thoughtful and prayerful about how to live out the mission of God before our family, friends, neighbors, co-workers all our social networks.
  - 2) Beginning to see ourselves as missionaries represents a profound learning curve for most Christians and most churches.
- c. Here's a verse that is powerful: "Seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf; for in its welfare you will have welfare." --Jeremiah 29:7
- d. An essential part of our calling as a church is to actively seek the welfare of the valley and beyond.
- e. Missional churches are characterized by a <u>great deal of respect</u> for those who don't believe missional churches and missional people take the time and effort to connect the gospel to base-line cultural narratives, hopes, problems, aspirations of our neighbors and co-workers because we inhabit the same world.
- f. I will conclude by identifying three simple ways to begin being missional:

## 1) Be Interested

- a) Are you fully present when you have even a brief opportunity to speak with your neighbors and colleagues?
- b) Listen deeply and reflectively. And I would add, steer away from giving too much advice. In your interactions let people know that you heard what they said and that you empathize with them.
- c) Laugh with those who laugh and weep with those who weep.
- 2) Be <u>Incarnational</u> (Are you real?)

- a) Sometimes we Christians think we have to put a façade up and pretend that everything is wonderful. I guarantee you, most people see right through that.
- b) Are you honest and appropriately real with the people in your social spheres?
- c) Let people see you struggle and doubt like the disciples in Matthew 28.
- d) And be generous with people. It's better to make a mistake by giving than to make a mistake by withholding. [Subway/Jared]
- 3) Be <u>Intentional</u> (Are you willing?)
  - a) Does the kingdom of God flow through your life to other people?
  - b) Do you believe that God has called you to bring the kingdom of God into your family and social spheres?
  - c) If you're more introverted, here's a way to engage: ask questions...talk about common experiences, ask for help or advice, inquire about the lives of those whom God has placed in your life.

# III. CONCLUSION

- A. So, God has a MISSION (to be known and enjoyed above all things), a MEANS (the gospel that we never outgrow), and a METHOD (you and me).
- B. It's been said that we serve a missionary God. The Father sent the Son, the Son sent the Holy Spirit, and the Holy Spirit sends us.
- C. Here is what I absolutely KNOW to be true: <u>God is already at work in the lives of every person you know</u>. Where can you be an encouragement? Where can you be redemptive?
