A Theology Of The INCARNATION:

The theological term used to indicate that Jesus, the Son of God took on human form. Literally, "the act of being made flesh," originating from the Latin version of John 1:14.

- 1) Jesus IS GOD. 2:6
- 2) As God, Jesus ALWAYS EXISTED. 2:6; John 1:1; Col 1:16
- 3) Jesus released his DIVINE POSITION without relinquishing his DEITY. 2:6-7
- 4) Jesus inhabited a HUMAN BODY. 2:7-8
- 5) Jesus willingly GAVE HIS LIFE to REDEEM us. 2:6-11

The Joy of Incarnation:

- > It's PROOF of God's LOVE for you.
- ➤ It's the source of STRENGTH to LIVE the faith in you. 1Cor 3:16; Php 1:6; Col 1:27; 1John 4:12
- ➤ It's the EXAMPLE of how God LOVES through you. John 13:17; Eph 5:2; Php 2:5
